Do you love working with kids and farm animals? Are you naturally curious with a love for learning and teaching? Ambler Farm Summer Camp is a unique farm that offers kids a chance to connect with the land, the animals, and each other while experiencing the outdoors. We are seeking a part-time Summer Program Counselor to support our Director of Programming in leading kids of all ages in Farm based activities through our summer camp and apprentice programs.

Duration: Flex time in May, camp hours start June 12th-August 11th, with a training day on June 3rd & 4th, 2023. Possible extension into the fall.

Hours: 8:00-1:30 and 1:30-3:30pm

Pay will range from \$15/hr-\$30 based on experience.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities:

- Work with the Camp Director and other Programs Counselor to develop educational programming for campers aged 4-14 years old
- Help prepare, facilitate, and organize programming related to farming and the natural environment, etc.(gardening, crafting, building, visiting the animals)
- Assist with daily camp activities
- Be a role model for campers and staff, arrive every day with an inclusive, professional, upbeat, and positive attitude
- Communicate with other staff about daily activities
- Set up and maintain supplies (i.e. crafting supplies, water stations, etc.)
- Follow safety and emergency procedures and guidelines
- Maintain a clean and safe workspace

Qualifications:

- 2+ years of working with children aged 4-17 years old
- Age 21+ preferred
- Willing to become CPR/First Aid certified
- Previous program planning experience or environmental background preferred
- Must be comfortable with public speaking/presenting to large and small groups
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills a must
- Comfortable working with farm animals
- Must have a willingness to perform all job duties with enthusiasm and a positive outlook
